WHAT IS ADDERALL?

Before people seek an Adderall addiction treatment program in Portland, they should know more about this medicine. It's a prescription medication designed to treat ADHD. In most cases, it works best for teenagers and adolescents.

Adderall is a combination of dextroamphetamine and amphetamine. These drugs work together to stimulate the central nervous system. They also change the amount of norepinephrine and dopamine that the brain produces. As a result, taking Adderall helps people with ADHD stay focused and pay attention. Using caffeine along with Adderall increases the likelihood of side effects.

MEDICAL USES FOR ADDERALL

Adderall works by altering brain chemicals and nerves that link to hyperactivity and impulse control. It comes in two forms: instant release and extended-release, both of which treat symptoms of ADHD. However, the FDA has only approved the instant release form to treat narcolepsy. Adderall users who develop a high tolerance may turn to more dangerous stimulants when Adderall stops working for them.

HOW ADDERALL WORKS

When individuals take this drug exactly as prescribed, Adderall is an effective treatment for ADHD. It works by stimulating the central nervous system. Physicians usually start patients on a very low dose to avoid any unwanted side effects and symptoms. Over time, the psychiatrist will gradually increase dosage as he or she sees appropriate.

ADDERALL WORKS TO TREAT ADHD IN MANY WAYS, INCLUDING:

- Making certain neurotransmitters in the brain, such as norepinephrine and dopamine, more available — these brain chemicals are important because they increase alertness, focus, and overall energy levels.
- Maximizing heart rate and blood flow to muscles





SIDE EFFECTS OF ADDERALL ADDICTION

Like all habit-forming substances, it's easy to develop an addiction to Adderall. People who use more Adderall than recommended by a doctor are at risk for developing negative side effects, chemical dependency, and needing substance abuse treatment.

Possible short-term side effects of Adderall addiction include:

- Insomnia
- Headache
- Dry mouth

- Loss of voice/hoarseness
- · Digestive issues and loss of appetite
- Aggression
- Shortness of breath

The long-term or heavy use of Adderall can result in more serious side effects, some of which may even be dangerous to the user. A few of these long-term side effects include:

- Changes in temperment
- · Lightheadedness and Chest pain
- Rashes or hives
- Vision complications
- Paranoia
- Mania
- Social withdrawal
- Seizures

If you experience any of the above long-term effects, you should consult a physician or seek medical attention as soon as possible. Overdosing on Adderall can result in dire consequences to one's health, including panic attacks, heart problems, and comas.
